

Cookies Enabling Instructions

Windows-based Systems

Internet Explorer 6 <ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ Click Tools, and then click Internet Options.➤ Click the Privacy tab.➤ Click the Advanced button.➤ Put a check mark in the Box for "Override Automatic Cookie Handling"➤ At the bottom, select the "Accept" option under First-party cookies, and put another check mark in the "Always allow session cookies" box.➤ Click on OK.	Netscape Navigator 4.x <ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ Click Edit (menu item), and then click Preferences.➤ Click Advanced in the left-hand (white background) Category area.➤ Select 'Accept all cookies' in the right-hand (grey background) options list.➤ Click on OK.
Internet Explorer 5 <ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ Click Tools (menu item), and then click Internet Options.➤ Click the Security tab.➤ Click the Internet zone.➤ Select a security level other than High. -or- Click Custom Level, scroll to the Cookies section, and then click Enable for both cookie options.	Netscape Navigator 3 <ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ You cannot disable cookies in this version of Netscape, but you can turn the cookies warning on and off. Here is how you can turn the warning off so that cookies will be accepted automatically.➤ Click Options, and then choose Network Preferences.➤ Click Protocols tab.➤ Under Show an Alert Before, click to "de-select" Accepting a Cookie.
Internet Explorer 4.x <ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ Click View (menu item), and then click Internet Options.➤ Click the Advanced tab.➤ Scroll to the Security section.➤ Under Cookies, click Always accept cookies.	America Online Version 5 <ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ In the AOL top menu bar, click on My AOL.➤ Select Preferences from the drop down menu.➤ In the Preferences window, click on WWW. The AOL Internet Properties window will appear.➤ Click on the Security tab.➤ Click on the Internet zone, then click on the Custom button on the bottom of the window. The Security Settings window will appear.➤ Scroll down until you see Cookies.➤ Click Enable.➤ Click on OK.
Internet Explorer 3 <ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ You cannot disable cookies in this version of Internet Explorer, but you can turn the cookies warning on and off. Here is how you can turn the warning off so that cookies will be accepted automatically.➤ Click View, and then click Options.➤ Click the Advanced tab.➤ Under Warnings, click to "de-select" Warn before accepting cookies.➤ Click on Apply.	America Online Version 3 and 4 <ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ Click on MY AOL on your AOL Toolbar.➤ Select Preferences.➤ Click on the WWW icon. The AOL Internet Properties window will appear.➤ Click on the Advanced tab from within the AOL Internet Properties window.➤ Click to "de-select" Warn before accepting cookies.

Macintosh Systems

Internet Explorer 4 and 3 <ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ Click Edit, and then click Preferences.➤ Click the Receiving Files arrow.➤ Click the Cookies button.➤ Under <i>When receiving cookies</i>, select <i>never ask</i>.➤ Click OK.	Netscape Communicator 4 <ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ Click Edit, and then click Preferences.➤ Click <i>Advanced</i> in the menu on the left-hand (white background) side of the screen.➤ Under <i>Cookies</i> on the right-hand part of the screen (gray background), click <i>Accept all cookies</i>.➤ Click OK.
America Online Version 4 <ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ Click on <i>MY AOL</i> on your AOL Toolbar.➤ Select <i>Preferences</i>.➤ Click on the <i>WWW</i> icon. The AOL Web Preferences window will appear.➤ Click on the <i>Advanced settings</i> button from within the AOL Web Preferences window.➤ Click the <i>Receiving Files</i> arrow so that the <i>Cookies</i> button appears beneath it.➤ Click on the <i>Cookies</i> button. The <i>Cookie Settings</i> window will appear to the right.➤ Under <i>When receiving cookies</i>, select <i>never ask</i>.➤ Click OK.	Netscape Navigator 3 <ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ You cannot disable cookies in this version of Netscape, but you can turn the cookies warning on and off. Here is how you can turn the warning off so that cookies will be accepted automatically.➤ Click <i>Options</i>, and then choose <i>Network Preferences</i>.➤ Click the <i>Protocols</i> tab.➤ Under <i>Show an Alert Before</i>, click to "de-select" <i>Accepting a Cookie</i>.➤ Click OK.
America Online Version 3 <p>This version of AOL for the Macintosh does not accept cookies.</p>	

Special Notes About Using AOL

If you are using the following AOL browsers, you will not be able to set cookie preferences since these browsers automatically accept cookies:

- AOL v3.0 for Windows 3.0, using AOL's proprietary browser or AOL's version of Microsoft Internet Explorer v3.0;
- AOL for the MAC, using AOL's version of Microsoft Internet Explorer 2.1.

All **other** earlier versions of AOL browsers do not support cookies, and therefore cannot authenticate you as a registered user. You might want to consider upgrading to version 3.0 or higher.

Sometimes people have trouble logging in when they follow a direct link on our newsletter through AOL. If this is the case, you might just want to try first logging into our website directly at www.nrm.com, then going to the page that is within the email.

If you continue to have problems with AOL, after signing on as usual, minimize your AOL browser and open up Internet Explorer or Netscape. These programs will run off of your AOL Internet connection.

Often times, AOL members do not realize that their username is their FULL e-mail address (i.e. bob@aol.com NOT bob). Your password is the one you chose when signing up.
